


Decreasing Scales of Review




Pathway to Prioritized Informed Resilience







The Socio-Economics of Coal Retirements




- A place-based set of principles, processes, & practices to build capacity to transition from an extractive economy to a regenerative economy
- Clean energy transition driving this
- For every job lost from a coal retirement, another 2 – 3 jobs are lost within the local economy
- Critical risk mitigation strategy to avert loss of population and plan for lost tax revenue as plants retire


